

TEACHER ADVISEMENT

COUNSELOR + ADVISOR = STRONG STUDENT SUPPORT

TEACHER ADVISORS

Advisement is designed as an opportunity for all students to hear about important upcoming information, deadlines, and events. A student's advisement teacher will remain the same throughout grades 9-12. Allows students to form a connection with a teacher on campus for additional support, including answering general questions.

STUDENT SUPPORT

COUNSELORS

Counselors provide Academic, College & Career, and Personal Social Support through individual meetings. conferences. class presentations, and student and parent presentations. Each counselor has 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grade TA's that make up their caseload. They assist students with making progress towards graduation and developing postsecondary goals.

FLEX TIME

Flex Time (25 minutes on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday) allows students to receive additional assistance in their classes including but not limited to:

- 1. Making up quizzes and tests
- 2. Making up assignments
- 3. Allows students to receive clarification on lessons
- 4. Allows students to get additional help from their teachers

All students are *required* to attend Flex Time. Students who do not attend are marked absent. Students make appointments with teachers on the <u>TeachMore</u> website during Advisement. If a student is tagged by a staff member, they must attend that specific Flex Time on the assigned date.

TRANSITION TO HIGH SCHOOL

9th GRADE COUNTS

- ★ Students develop important study skills for the rest of high school when coursework will become more challenging.
- ★ Students will become more independent checking their own grades and speaking to their teachers on their own. This is an important skill to support as parents.
- ★ Students report coursework and grades from 9th grade on college applications. This is a foundational year for academics.
- ★ Coursework chosen in 9th grade does not "track" your student through high school. There is always an opportunity to move into Honors and/or AP later on in high school.

SUPPORTING YOUR STUDENT

- ★ Choose a manageable amount of coursework for your student. This will build confidence and ensure academic success their freshman year.
- ★ Encourage your student to get involved.....but not too involved where they are not able to manage all their responsibilities.
- ★ Look for and address any signs of stress.
- ★ Talk with your student about how they are feeling about the transition. Listen and empathize with your appropriately nervous student. Help them find answers to their questions and keep lines of communication open.
