
Private Colleges and Universities

COMMUNITY COLLEGE

- 116 campuses
- Two-Year Colleges
- Must be a HS Grad or 18 years old or HS Equivalency (GED/HiSET)
- SAT or ACT are not required
- Multiple Measure Evaluation
 - Highest level of Math/English in HS
- Consider Honor Programs
 - o 3.25 Unweighted GPA, Application
- Promise Program








CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY

- 23 Campuses
- 4-Year Colleges
- Minimum 15 A-G Subject
 Requirements
- Minimum 2.5 GPA in Grades 10-12
 - o Grades 9-12 for Cal Poly Slo
- Must pass A-G classes with Cor higher
- SAT and ACT not required
- Application Window October 1st
 - November 30th



UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA

- 9 Campuses
- 4-year College
- Minimum 15 A-G Subject
 Requirements
- Minimum 3.0 GPA in Grades 10-12
- Must pass A-G classes with C- or higher
- SAT or ACT not required
- Application Window August
 1st November 30th



PRIVATE/INDEPENDENT COLLEGES

- 100+ campuses in CA
- 1700+ campuses across the US (Common Application)
- Campuses have a variety of admissions requirements and programs
- Letters of Recommendation from teachers and counselor are generally required
- SAT or ACT Check individual colleges
- Deadlines vary
- Check college websites for more information


