MINIMUM HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

- ★ New Requirements for Class of 2027 and beyond.
- ★ 225 Total Credits
- ★ Courses must be passed with a D- or higher to count towards graduation.
- \bigstar 10 credits = 1 year

English- 40 credits

Math- 30 credits (Must include Math 2)

Science- 30 credits

Social Science- 30 credits

PE-20 credits

VPA or World Language or CTE-10 credits

Health-5 credits

Electives- 60 credits

MINIMUM A-G REQUIREMENTS (CSU & UC)

- ★ 225 Total Credits
 - Courses must be passed with a C- or higher to count towards A-G requirements.
 - 1 year = 10 credits

- A. History 20 credits/2 years
- B. English 40 credits/4 years
- C. Math 30 credits/3 years (Must include Math 3)
- D. Science 20 credits/2 years of lab science
- E. World Language- 20 credits/2 years of same language
- F. Visual/Performing Art 10 credits/1 year
- G. College Preparatory Elective- 10 credits/1 year **
- ** 3rd Year of Social Science automatically meets this requirement.

MINIMUM CREDITS/MAXIMUM CREDITS

Required Credits

ALL Freshmen must be enrolled in 60 credits, including:

- Recommended academics (Math, Science, English)
- Freshman PE / Team Sports/Colorguard/Dance
- Electives

Additional credits may be selected from:

• Credit Plus courses can be found on the 9th Grade Course List and are notated with a CR+ next to the course title.

Most students academic courses will equal 40-50 credits, which will allow for 10-20 non Credit Plus elective credits.

Frequently Asked Question's



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What is the maximum amount of credits/classes you can take?

Students can enroll in a maximum of 60 credits, unless they choose credit plus courses. Anything beyond the 60 credits must be selected from credit plus courses (CR+). Credit plus classes are mainly athletics and visual/performing arts.

My student was recommended for Social Science. Is that an elective?

Students will not be enrolled in this class unless you choose Honors Modern World History as an elective (even if it is recommended by your 8th grade teacher).

Besides PE or a team sports, what else counts as PE for a freshman?

Color Guard

Dance 1 or Hip Hop Dance (Dance 2, 3, 4 & Ensemble are audition only)

What happens if my sport does not have an off-season? Do I have to be in PE?

Yes, all freshmen need to be enrolled in PE or a team sport at all times.

(*Off season- the time of the year that the team sports are just participating in training & have no games)

Q: What do I do if I have issues with Aeries/Parent Portal?

A: Parents need to make sure they're using the https://imy.lusd.org site to sign in to their Parent Portal. If the email that you are using is not the same as the one you used upon registering their student then it will not be linked together and therefore not work. Also, on https://imy.lusd.org you can reset your password if you forgot it. Once you're logged on, you can see your student on the top right tabs. Q: Should my student have an Aeries Student Portal Account?
