## GCU'S SIX COMMITMENTS FOR REWARDING EXPERIENCES

**1 Start Strong, Finish Strong:** GCU begins preparing students for their careers and futures right at the beginning of their first year. Students have access to opportunities and complimentary resources that support their college experience, academics, real-world learning, wellness and personal growth all the way through graduation and beyond.

**2 Early Graduation:** Committed to affordability, GCU offers fast-track options for students to accelerate their college journey. Students who graduate in less than four years can pay less in tuition and college expenses, as well as enter their graduate program or career sooner.

**3 Low Student Debt:** GCU helps make a private college education affordable and accessible by offering generous institutional scholarships.

**4 Home Away from Home:** Students become a part of a supportive, diverse and safe community. Opportunities to get involved in campus life, Academic and Career Excellence (ACE) Centers, Chapel and Life Groups, Public Safety and many other services help turn campus into a second home for Lopes.

**6 One Application:** Many colleges and universities have implemented additional measures of evaluation before permitting upperclassmen to complete their major course of study. Secondary acceptance requires an additional application, a second review of previously submitted materials and/or a minimum GPA requirement. These secondary measures can potentially delay graduation and incur greater expense. At GCU, most incoming students are accepted into their program of study without a secondary review, with the exception of our nursing and athletic training programs, which require secondary acceptance due to clinical restrictions.

# CAMPUS SCHOLARSHIPS

At Grand Canyon University, we offer generous scholarship opportunities to help make a private Christian education affordable. On average, a student qualifies for approximately \$7,900\* in GCU-funded scholarships for the academic year, which reduces overall tuition by nearly half. We have proudly maintained this traditional campus rate for 12 years and our frozen tuition will continue to remain steady in 2021-22.

To maintain a GCU-funded institutional scholarship each year, students must be a campus traditional undergraduate student and be admissible to GCU. The following GCU-funded academic scholarships are renewable annually and can be locked in for up to four years for most programs. ### High School Academic Scholarship Program

High school student scholarships are based on their weighted high school GPA. If they do not have a weighted GPA, they can apply their unweighted GPA (minimum of 2.5 GPA) plus ACT or SAT test score.

### Transfer Academic Scholarship Program

Transfer and International F-1 Visa students with 24 or more college level credits are eligible for transfer academic scholarships based on their cumulative college GPA. Test scores will not be considered.

### GAP Year/High School International F-1 Visa Academic Scholarship Program

GAP year students who do not enroll at GCU the semester following high school graduation, international F-1 Visa high school students or students with less than 24 college level credits are eligible for scholarships based on their weighted high school GPA. If a weighted GPA was not calculated, the unweighted GPA will be used. ACT and SAT scores require a minimum 2.5 unweighted high school GPA.

\* Average tuition after scholarships is approximately \$8,600. Scholarships may be awarded based on 6th semester transcripts. At the time in which final, official transcripts are received, GCU reserves the right to rescind or modify the scholarship if it is determined that eligibility was not achieved. GCU reserves the right to decline scholarship awards for any reason. If a student does not meet the minimum renewal criteria, their scholarship will be forfeited. GCU reserves the right to change scholarship awards at any time without notice. Prices based on 2019-20 rate and are subject to change.

\*\* The Chancellor award is the only scholarship level that requires an unweighted GPA for eligibility. There are a limited number of Chancellor awards and they are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

\* If the student is admitted based on ACT or SAT, they will need a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 2.5 to be awarded the scholarship.

# ADDITIONAL GCU SCHOLARSHIPS

### Priority Registration Award

This program awards scholarships from \$200 – \$800 per academic year based on the number of awards available at the time of registration and whether students live on or off campus. This award is renewable annually for the fall and spring, up to eight semesters. There are a limited number of Priority Registration Awards and all requirements for registration and attendance must be met to receive this award.

### Grand Canyon University Award

This program awards \$1,000 per academic year to Arizona students and \$250 to out-of-state students who graduate from one of GCU's participant high schools. Students attending one of the Maricopa County Community College campuses must have earned an associate degree or equivalent for the award. This award is renewable annually for fall and spring, up to eight semesters. This award cannot be combined with the Canyon Christian Schools Consortium Award.

### Canyon Christian Schools Consortium

This program is for qualified students who have graduated from a CCSC participant school. This program awards \$4,000 per academic year to on-campus students and \$1,500 per academic year to off-campus students. This award is renewable annually for fall and spring, up to eight semesters. This award requires the student to join a campus worship service weekly and meet the 40-hour service requirement each academic year. GCU determines where each student serves to meet the requirement. This award cannot be combined with the Grand Canyon University Award.

### CSET Award

This program awards \$500 per academic year to students who enroll in one of the following programs: computer science, computer programming, information technology or engineering. This award is renewable annually for fall and spring, up to eight semesters and as long as the student stays enrolled in a qualified CSET award program at GCU. There are a limited number of awards and they are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. This award cannot be combined with the Phi Theta Kappa Award or the Psi Beta Award.

### Phi Theta Kappa and Psi Beta Awards

This program awards \$1,000 per academic year to students who are a current member of Phi Theta Kappa or Psi Beta and have a 3.5 or greater cumulative weighted college GPA. These awards are renewable annually for the fall and spring, up to eight semesters. These awards are available on a first-come, first-serve basis and cannot be combined with each other or the CSET Award.

GCU institutional scholarships are allowed to be combined up to the following limits:  
 i. Chancellor/Chancellor-IB/President Scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$15,000  
 ii. All other scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$12,500  
 iii. All scholarship recipients living off campus – up to \$10,000  
 iv. Micro-scholarships may not be combined with any other form of GCU-funded institutional aid or scholarships. Micro-scholarships may replace GCU institutional aid – up to \$6,000 per academic year.
