What is Financial Aid?



 Financial aid is any college funding that does not come from family, personal savings or earnings.

 Grants, Scholarships, Work-Study, Federal and Private Loans

 Can be used to pay for tuition, fees, room and board, books, supplies, transportation, etc.

Types of Financial Aid

 - Free Application Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - 2) Grants, Loans, Work Study
- CA Dream Act Application dream.csac.ca.gov
- Cal Grant csac.ca.gov
- <u>Individual School Aid</u>: Contact financial aid office at schools you are considering.
- Scholarships: Naviance, IHS Counseling Website, etc.

Create a FSA ID

HOW TO CREATE AN FSA ID:

- 1. Enter your email address
- 2. Create a username
- 3. Create a password
- 4. Enter your name, date of birth, and Social Security number
- 5. Enter your mobile phone number

- 6. Set up 4 challenge questions
- 7. Read and accept the terms
- 8. Verify your mobile phone number
- 9. Verify your email address




How to apply to FAFSA

 - June 30, 2023


- Check the list of schools to see if any of the colleges to which you are applying require completion

FAFSA/CA Dream Act Completion Day

 AB 469 - new California state law that requires every high school ensure that each senior complete the FAFSA or California Dream Act form for financial aid.


Students may request to opt out of completing the form.

- Irvine High School FAFSA Completion Day
 - Wednesday, October 12th (During 9th-11th Grade Testing)
 - Irvine High School Counselors in conjunction with the California Student Aid Commission will assist seniors with completing and submitting their FAFSA applications.



- Cal Grants are for students who are pursuing an undergraduate degree, vocational, or career training and do not have to be repaid. You have to meet the financial criteria.
- Must apply for FAFSA and CADAA by deadline
- GPA verification is required for Cal Grant consideration. Submission of your GPA is done automatically for you by IUSD unless you "opt out."
- For students attending UC, CSU, community colleges, or qualifying independent and career colleges or technical schools



Welcome to the Financial Aid Net Price Calculator!



We understand that you and your family may have a lot of concerns about how you'll cover your costs of tuition, housing and other necessities. Through a variety of programs available, Financial Aid and Scholarships office can help you to cover your educational costs.

To apply for financial aid, please make sure that you complete a <u>FAFSA</u> after October 1 and **before March 2** priority filing deadline. This will ensure that you are considered for the maximum of funding that may be available. In the meantime, our Net Price Calculator will allow you to generate an estimate of your financial aid eligibility. In order to make sure that this estimate is correct, it is very important that you provide as accurate information as possible.

This calculator is intended only for full-time, undergraduate students who are California Residents and eligible to file a FAFSA. A calculator for out of state residents will be available soon! Dream Act applicants and graduate students should contact Financial Aid and Scholarships office for more information.

- Log into your Naviance account and check the National Scholarship Service frequently to see updated scholarship information
- Search & Apply for Scholarships! Meet deadlines
- Talk with your family about college costs

- Remember the deadlines will vary with each college
- March 2nd FAFSA Deadline Make sure you check with individual campuses to see if they have an earlier deadline!
- Be organized, don't panic and ask questions

3 Signs of a Student Aid Scam



1 You have to pay an upfront cost or monthly fees.

2 They promise guaranteed financial aid.

3 You have to provide your username and password (FSA ID).



- No person or organization can guarantee you admission to college or financial aid
- There are no secrets on how to get more financial aid
