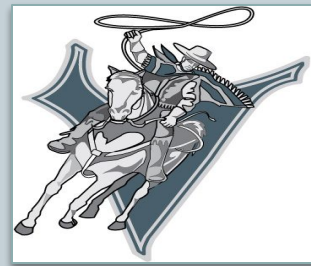

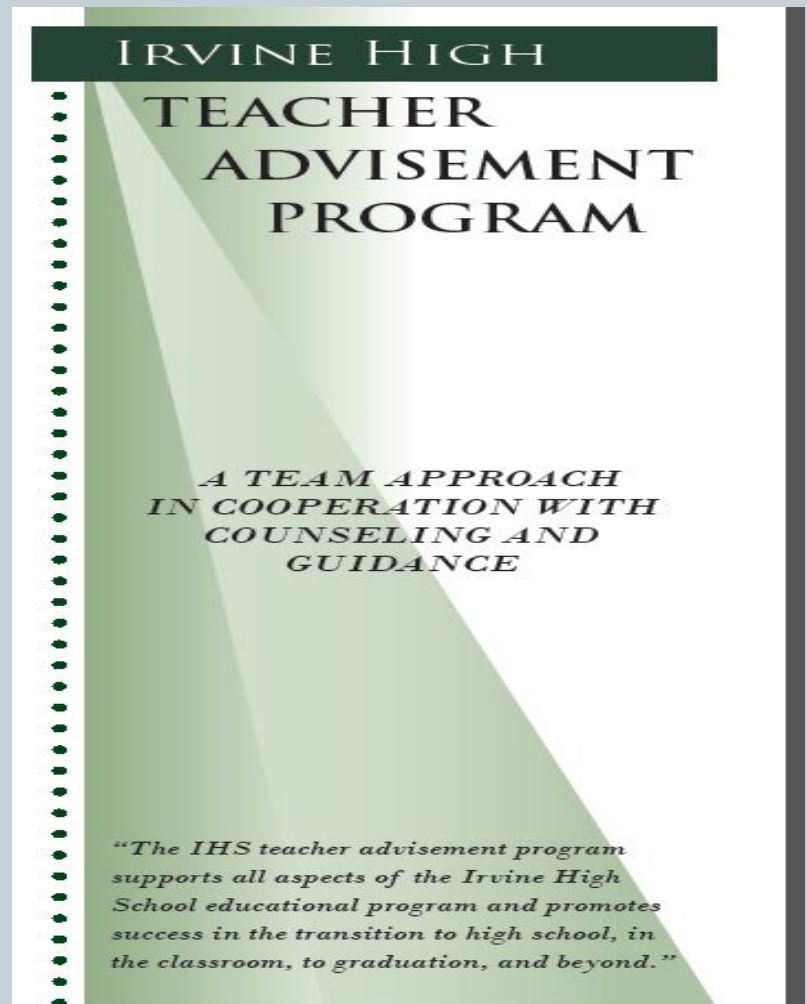

PRACTICE 9th Grade Course Request Worksheet 2018-2019

PLEASE NOTE: Placement in English, math, science, social science and upper level world language is determined by the middle school teachers' recommendations. All 9th graders are required to be enrolled in Freshman PE, Color Guard, Dance 2 (or higher) or a team sport for the entire year. Most team sports, Color Guard, and Dance 2 (and higher) require a tryout.

INSTRUCTIONS: In the REQUIRED COURSES section, you will see the recommendations made by your middle school teachers. In the FLECTIVE COURSES section, enter your elective choices in the order of your preference and provide alternative choices, in the event that original choices are not available. 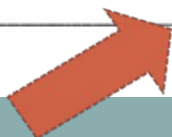

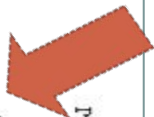
