Summer

- ◇ If planning to participate in team sports, attend summer camps
- ◇ Attend Freshman Round –Up
- ◇ Attend Freshman Link Crew Orientation
- ◇ Familiarize yourself with IHS graduation requirements and minimum college requirements

Fall

- ◇ Get acclimated to Irvine High School
 - Familiarize yourself with our campus and bell schedule
 - Meet your counselor and TA
 - Set up and learn how to use Aeries.net and Canvas
- ◇ Create a College Board account to check PSAT scores and link to Khan Academy for test prep
- ◇ Set yourself up for success.....be in class, on time every day!
- ◇ Give your best effort in all your classes (all semester grades will be posted on your Irvine High transcript).
- ◇ Get into the habit of talking to teachers whenever you have questions about class materials
- ◇ If you have English fall semester, counselors will present in your English class
- ◇ Stay healthy and balanced! See your counselor if you are feeling stressed, have questions or need some support!
- ◇ Get involved in extra-curricular activities (find meaningful activities that you will enjoy)
- ◇ Evaluate your friendships.....maintain friendships that are healthy and share your interests
- ◇ Evaluate your fall semester grades and determine goals for spring semester

Spring

- ◇ Spring semester is a fresh start! Now that you have one semester under your belt, continue what is working, tweak what isn't and work toward your goals.
- ◇ Continue with meaningful extra-curricular activities
- ◇ Continue to see teachers with questions about class content that you don't understand
- ◇ Stay healthy and balanced! See your counselor if you are feeling stressed, have questions or need some support!
- ◇ Course Request Contract Days in April: Teachers will sign your Course Request Contract for class recommendations for sophomore year
- ◇ Spring Conference: Your TA will input your course requests for next year based on your Course Request Contract.
- ◇ If applicable, sign up for summer school to remediate courses for graduation or college eligibility (see counselor with questions)
- ◇ Evaluate spring semester grades and freshman year as whole– determine goals for sophomore year
